

READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY

1st Reading: Speaking of the Israel's return from exile, Isaiah prophesies the New Jerusalem, in which the Lord will let his glory shine forth, drawing all nations to sing his praises.

2nd Reading: Through Christ who reveals the mystery of God's love, the pagans now share the same inheritance as the people of the gospel.

Gospel: The wise men find the Infant King by following the star. They worship him in the name of the pagan nations who will come to knowledge of God through the preaching of the Gospel.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION 2022
Application forms will be available in January. The course is for children in Y3-6 & we use the "I Belong" materials. Forms will be available at church on the website and through St Mary's Primary School. We need to know how many want to be prepared to receive the Sacrament so we can involve all the young people in our parish despite COVID restrictions.

Coming to Mass during a pandemic:
Booking: Please book a seat before coming to Sunday Mass. Use either Eventbrite <https://bookmass-2jan-27feb.eventbrite.co.uk> (by 5.00pm on Saturdays) or the booking phone 07415000566 (for those who do not use the internet). If booking by phone, book by noon on Saturdays.
*Use the NHS COVID-19 app to scan the QR codes on entering the church or parish centre; or leave a name for each family member over 16 and a phone number on entering the church.
*No need to book for weekday Masses; scan the QR code on arrival and leave a name and phone number for Track & Trace purposes.
*Please use the hand sanitiser.
*Face coverings must be worn in church unless you are exempt. Children aged 0-11 do not need a mask. *You can pick up a "Please leave a space" card on entering the church, to place on the seat immediately beside you.
*Stewards act as welcomers to the church. They help people sign in, go to communion and leave safely.
*Communion: move as directed by stewards.
*Holy Communion is under one kind
*The Sign of Peace remains suspended
*Please leave as directed by the stewards
*If you can help as a steward or a reader, talk to Fr Jeremy.

SANCTUARY LAMPS: 7-day candles are available to purchase for your intentions. Envelopes available at the entrance to the church in which you can specify the lamp & the intention. Minimum offering per candle £5.00 to cover its cost. Please give the envelope to Fr Jeremy or one of the stewards, who will put it in the sacristy.
